### **Office of Community Engagement and Outreach**

The Office of Community Engagement and Outreach, within the Division of Diversity and Engagement provides resources to assist UT administration, departments, faculty, staff, and community partners to address issues of concern to society by encouraging and facilitating external partnerships. Designated as a flagship, land-grant and community-engaged university by the Carnegie Foundation, we strive to connect the university's knowledge with that of the community in ways that are mutually beneficial. ### **Extension**

UT Extension helps Tennesseans improve their quality of life and solve problems through the application of research and evidenced-based knowledge about agriculture and natural resources, family and consumer sciences, 4-H youth development, and community development. It is a statewide educational organization within the UT Institute of Agriculture and is, funded by federal, state, and local government.

### **Multicultural Student Life**

Multicultural Student Life contributes to an inclusive learning environment by enhancing institutional efforts in retaining and graduating students prepared for a diverse global society. The office promotes the academic success, equality, and leadership development of students through programs and services that holistically address cultural, educational, and civic growth. Many of the programs are open to the public.

### **Center for Career Development**

The Center for Career Development is the centralized career services office at the University of Tennessee. Staff work with students of all majors and degree levels and employers across all industries. The center assists community partners in developing internship programs and recruiting interns, full and part-time employees, and service corps members. Staff also collaborate with students and community partners to offer programming such as career fairs, networking panels, and more.

### **Jones Center for Leadership and Service**

The mission of the Jones Center for Leadership and Service is to educate and engage all students to lead and serve the global community. The goal is to meet community needs through volunteerism and student service experiences that promote positive partnerships on campus and in the community.

### **Student-Athlete Leadership**

Student-Athlete Development is designed to prepare UT's student-athletes for life after the completion of their collegiate careers. Their purpose is to facilitate opportunities that will develop the holistic individual through service experiences, leadership development programs and career preparedness. The program partners with various community organizations across all sectors for service opportunities, internship placement, and job fairs through-out the academic year.

### **Center for Global Engagement**

The principal role of the Center for Global Engagement is to lead, coordinate, and support the university's strategies for global education, research, and engagement. That is achieved through developing and managing international partnerships, welcoming and assisting international students and scholars, providing education abroad opportunities for our students, and creating international and inter-cultural programming for the campus and broader Knoxville community.

### **Social Work Office of Research and Public Service**

The Social Work Office of Research and Public Service (SWORPS) works cooperatively with state agencies, regional policy makers, and social service agencies to help enhance and improve public programs and the delivery of public services. The overarching mission is to improve the lives of children and families by helping improve the quality of human service practice. The broad scope of research skills and staff-development expertise allows SWORPS to be involved at any stage of a project, from its development, through the implementation, including data collection, analysis, evaluation, and reporting. Services related to publications and media, software development, and e-learning are also offered.
